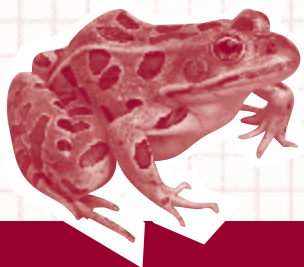

## INSTRUCTIONS—APPLICATION FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION

This application is for new freshman and transfer applicants to the Duluth campus. We define freshmen as students who have no previous college work or have completed college credits while enrolled in high school. Transfer students are those who will have completed at least one college credit of baccalaureate level course work, including credits now in progress, following high school graduation or equivalent.

THE FOLLOWING STUDENTS SHOULD USE A DIFFERENT APPLICATION FORM:

(Previous *extension-only* or *summer-only* students who now plan to seek a degree *should* use this form.)

TO AVOID DELAYS IN PROCESSING YOUR APPLICATION, PLEASE:

- Complete the correct application form.
- Make sure the name on your application form matches the name on your transcripts.

YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE KEPT ON FILE FOR ONE YEAR. THE APPLICATION FEE IS GOOD FOR TWO SEMESTERS (one academic year).

## CHECKLIST—PLEASE SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO COMPLETE YOUR APPLICATION:

- A completed application form, signed and dated.** Items with dark circled numbers (e.g., ❶) are required. They will be used for identification, to determine admission, and to establish your University academic record if you are admitted.
- A \$35 nonrefundable application fee.** Make your check or money order payable to the University of Minnesota. Include the student name (first, middle, last) and Social Security number or birthdate in check memo.
- An official high school transcript** for grades 9-12 or GED scores. New freshman and transfer applicants must submit a high school transcript. Admission is contingent upon completion of high school diploma or equivalency requirements.
- Test scores** for freshmen or transfer students with less than 26 credits: ACT Plus Writing or SAT scores are required. For students whose native language is not English: TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) may be requested. GED scores must be submitted for students who are not high school graduates, in addition to high school transcript for the period of attendance.
- Official college or university transcripts** for any applicant who has attempted college coursework: an *official* transcript from *all* colleges or universities attended is required, even if no credit was earned and even if the courses from one school appear on the transcript from another school.

## PRIORITY APPLICATION DEADLINES

Fall semester: December 15

Spring semester: November 15

All application materials must be postmarked on or before the deadline. Applications are considered until the final deadline of August 1 based on space.

## PREPARING FOR STUDY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

All students planning studies<sup>1</sup> in baccalaureate programs at the University of Minnesota Duluth are expected to complete as a minimum the following courses either while in grades 9-12 or at an accredited postsecondary institution.<sup>2</sup>

1. FOUR YEARS OF ENGLISH, with emphasis on writing, including instruction in reading and speaking skills and in literary understanding and appreciation;
2. THREE YEARS OF MATHEMATICS, including one year each of elementary algebra, geometry, and intermediate algebra;
3. THREE YEARS OF SCIENCE, including one year each of biological and physical science;
4. TWO YEARS OF A SINGLE SECOND LANGUAGE;
5. THREE YEARS OF SOCIAL STUDIES, including U.S. history and geography.

We strongly recommend that students also include visual and performing arts courses and computer skills courses in their college preparatory program.

These requirements are considered *minimum* preparation for bachelor's degree programs. Individual colleges may also require additional preparation.

Colleges **may** admit some students to bachelor's degree programs who have not met these requirements. The method of meeting these requirements after admission will be determined on a case-by-case basis; students may be required to take additional course work.

<sup>1</sup> Students who graduated from high school before 1987 are not expected to meet the requirements.

<sup>2</sup> These minimum preparation requirements are considered along with performance criteria (i.e., high school rank, ACT Plus Writing or SAT test scores, and previous postsecondary course work) in determining admissibility.
