



"Sunday Memos"


The "Sunday Memos" are .pdf memos, like this one, that arrive by e-mail (usually, as you might expect, on Sunday).


It's fine for you to select the items that interest you most from each of the "Sunday Memos" (including this one).



De-clutter Your Screen


Whenever you land on your Canvas "Modules" folder it's generally a good idea to . . .

(Sorry; Canvas does not permit instructors to set the default to open with all modules closed.)






Then open the Module of the week that you want to look at . . :

Both the **Canvas Modules** and the "**Sunday Memos**" . . . follow the same basic outline.


