




Thursday we'll have a look at Mead's most notable critic, Derek Freeman.


Margaret Mead and her pioneering work brought Culture and Personality studies of age . . . but it also eventually fostered


# one of the all-time great debates of Anthropology —nay all of social science: The Mead-Freeman Debate.


