The University of Minnesota is currently moving from Moodle to a new learning management system called Canvas— canvas. This is a two year process, and you will likely use both systems during the transition. I will be using Canvas for this class. If you have not used Canvas before, I suggest you log in and familiarize yourself with the new system before class begins.

How to Access this course in Canvas

All courses, whether taught using Canvas or Moodle, can be accessed through the [MyU portal](#) under Key Links or on the Academics tab. Canvas classes can also be found by going to canvas.umn.edu.

Your first time logging into Canvas you must accept the “terms of use”. If you don’t, you will not be able to see your classes.
