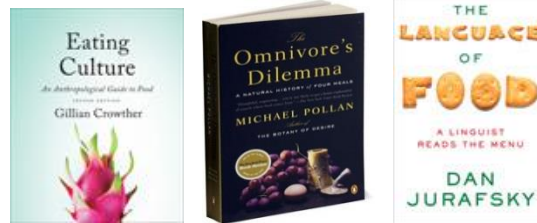

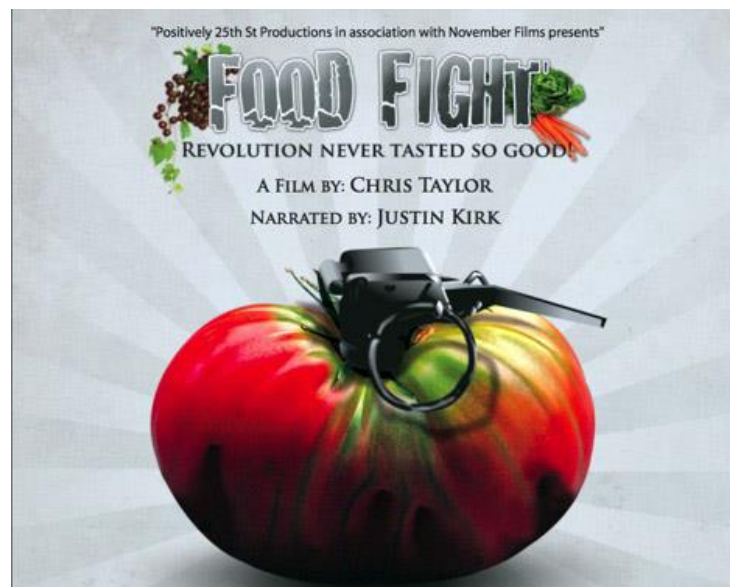
# *Food Fight*
