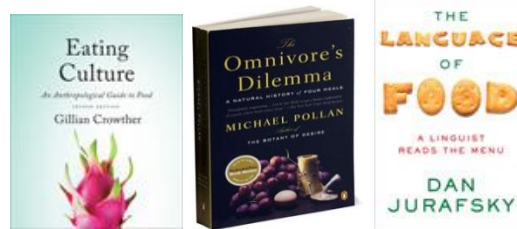

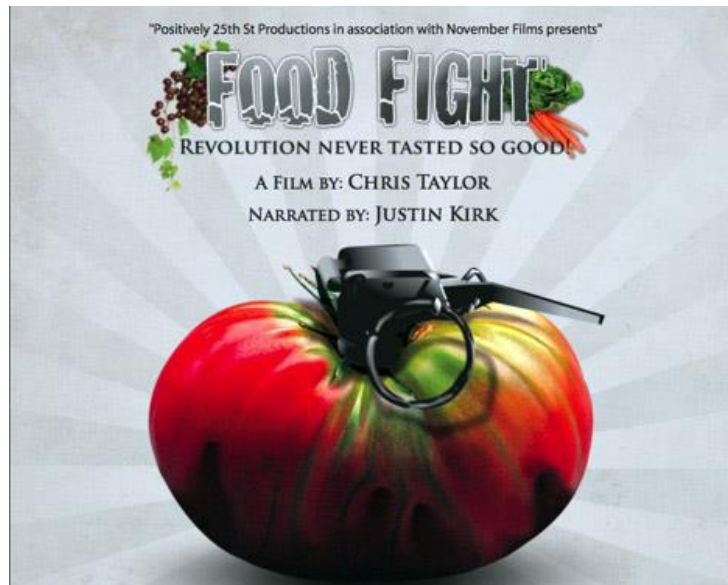
# ***Food Fight***


