

Pre-Pharmacy

Pre-pharmacy is not a major; it refers to a specific curriculum, or set of courses, required for admission to pharmacy school. Pre-pharmacy studies can be completed at UMD in three years, and some students choose to complete a four-year Bachelor of Science degree before entering pharmacy school. The Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree is a four-year program after completion of the pre-pharmacy curriculum. The University of Minnesota Pharm.D. program is offered through the College of Pharmacy on the Twin Cities campus and on the Duluth campus.
