PRE-OPTOMETRY PROGRAM

Pre-optometry is not a major; it is a specific curriculum, or set of courses, that are required for admission to optometry school. Required undergraduate coursework for pre-optometry students is extensive and covers a wide variety of advanced health, science, and mathematics courses. In addition to the required curriculum, most optometry schools either require or strongly recommend the completion of an undergraduate degree prior to entering optometry school. For this reason, most students choose a major and complete the requirements for a bachelor's degree prior to applying to optometry school.

Most optometry schools and colleges require applicants to complete an application, write a personal essay; submit transcripts from colleges attended by the applicant; take the Optometry Admission Test (OAT) and submit scores; provide letters of recommendation; participate in a personal interview; and demonstrate experience or exposure to the field of optometry.*
