Apartment rental in the area is expensive. Rates for a one bedroom apartment, unfurnished average \$700-\$900 per month, plus utilities and telephone service charges. Food, if most of the preparation is done at home, can range from \$100-\$200 per month. If you need to purchase or rent furniture, linen and cooking utensils, the set-up cost could range from \$100-\$500. Additional funds will be required for emergency dental or eye care, and long distance phone calls.

Students should be aware, even if they are receiving financial assistance from the University that they will need to have with them from \$1000 to meet their initial expenses. Students who receive a salary from an assistantship may not receive their first check until they have worked for at least two weeks. Funds will be needed for rent, food, books, and transportation before the first check is available.

Please keep in mind that these figures are just estimated and are subject to change at any given time. The purpose of these figures is to give you some idea of what the cost would be for one academic year at UMD.
