

## BIOGRAPHY: JAMIE RATLIFF



Dr. Jamie L. Ratliff is an Assistant Professor of Art History in the department of Art & Design at the University of Minnesota Duluth, where she teaches classes on Contemporary, Non-Western, and Latin American Art.

Ratliff holds a Ph.D. in art history from the University of Louisville, as well as graduate certificates in Latin American/Latino Studies and Women's and Gender Studies, and an M.A. in art history from Tufts University. Her research interests broadly focus on gender and art, representations of women, and social justice and protest in Latin America.

Specifically, Ratliff writes about contemporary feminist art in Mexico and how the works of artists such as Teresa Margolles, Daniella Rossell, and Paula Santiago, among others, challenge the long tradition of Mexican nationalism built on traditional gender, as well as racial, ethnic, and class, roles. Her research has been published in international journals such as *Arteologie*, the *Journal of Curatorial Studies*, and *n.paradoxa: international feminist art journal*.
