### OVERVIEW OF INTERVIEWS WITH COMMUNITY SOCIAL WORKERS IN ORDER TO GET CASE SCENERIOS FOR YOUR GROUPS ASSIGNMENTS, AND LIST OF SOCIAL WORKERS YOU CAN CONTACT

Below is a list of community clinical social workers, each of whom has agreed to do a 30 minute telephone interview with you in order to provide a case scenario that you can use for your group assignments (or to give you feedback on whether a case you have chosen is indeed “complex” and “challenging” by community standards). As described in the syllabus, these individuals will only provide you with the framework of the case, and you’ll have to “make up” the details later on if it’s one that your group ultimately chooses to work on. We’ve asked these them to provide you with a case that either already involves a DSM diagnosis or where this is likely, and where pharmaceutical interventions may be needed, All cases will of course involve “person-in-environment” interventions.

Besides discussing the components of the case, you should also use the interview to gain an understanding of why the social worker considers this case to be very complex and challenging.

Note that you need not interview someone on our list, but can instead talk to another community social work clinician who can provide you with a case that meets the standards of the assignment.

Before doing these interviews, review the guidelines in the syllabus. **Note that the interviews needed to be completed between January 22 and February 5th.**
