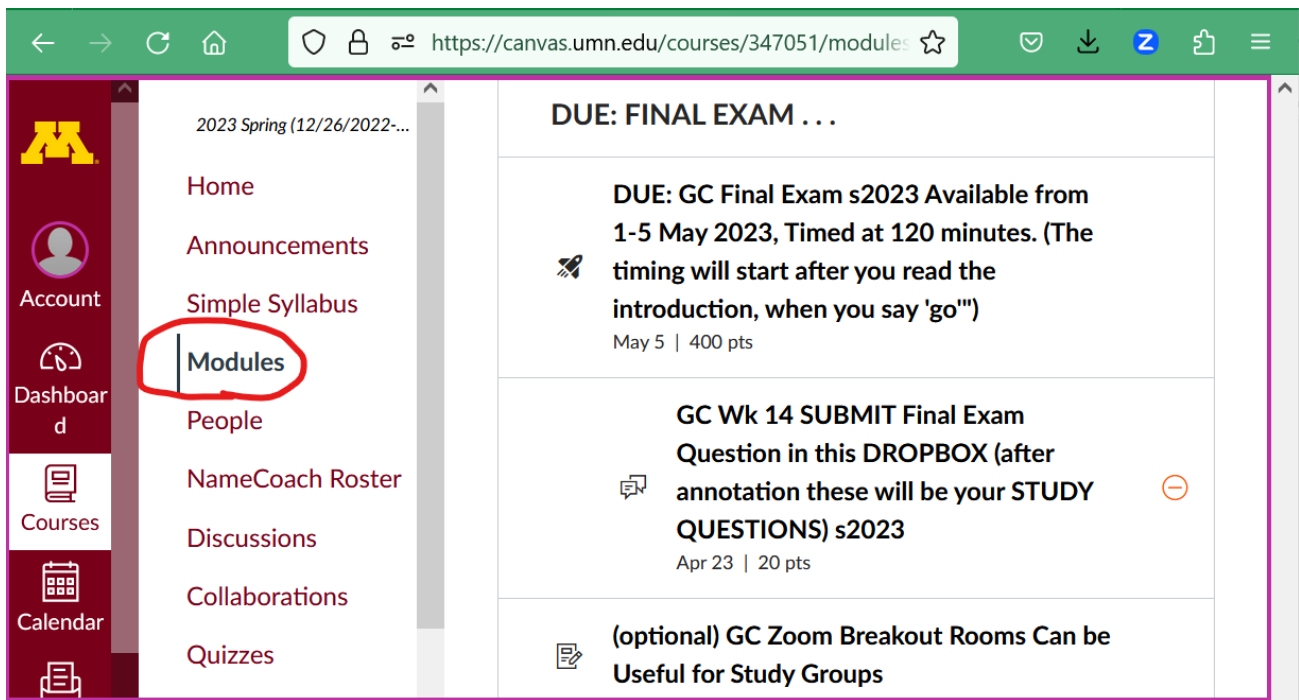
Each question is worth up to 100 points each. They will include . . .

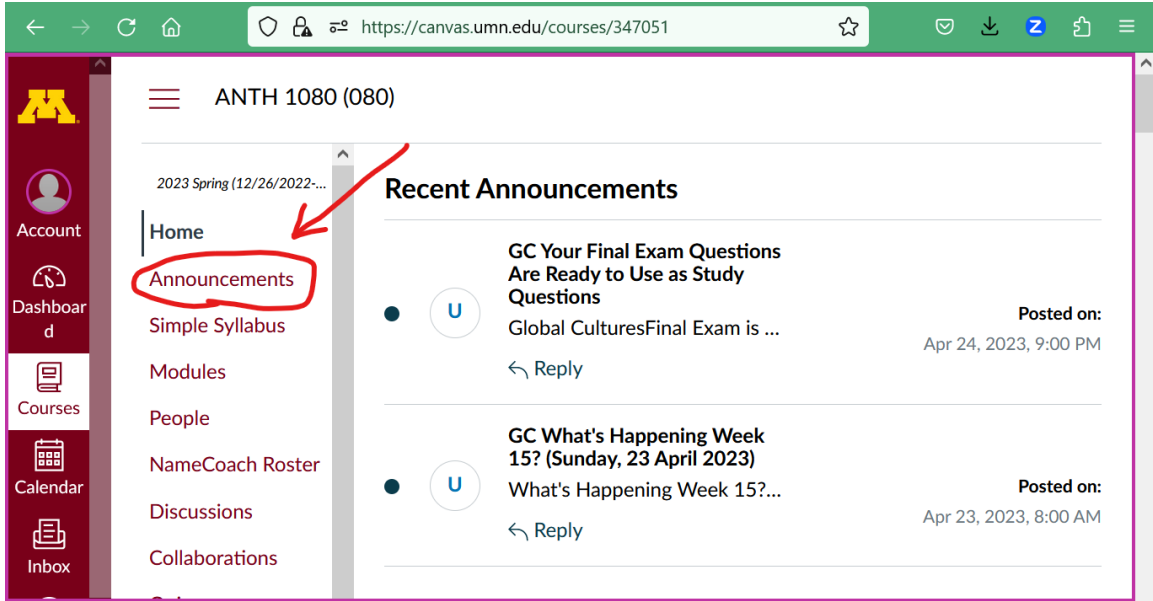
