If neither of these options applies to you, and you just feel like a little more late-autumn procrastination is in order, just relax and enjoy the autumn

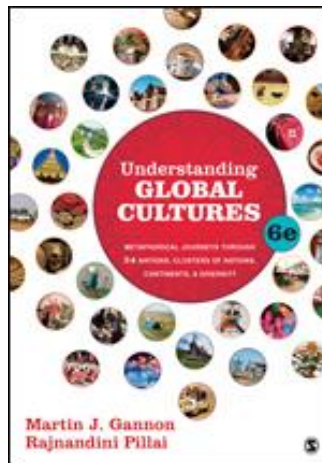
weather—wherever you happen to be, and enjoy the rest of your break.

The Canvas Student Guide / Overview / Tour can be very helpful.

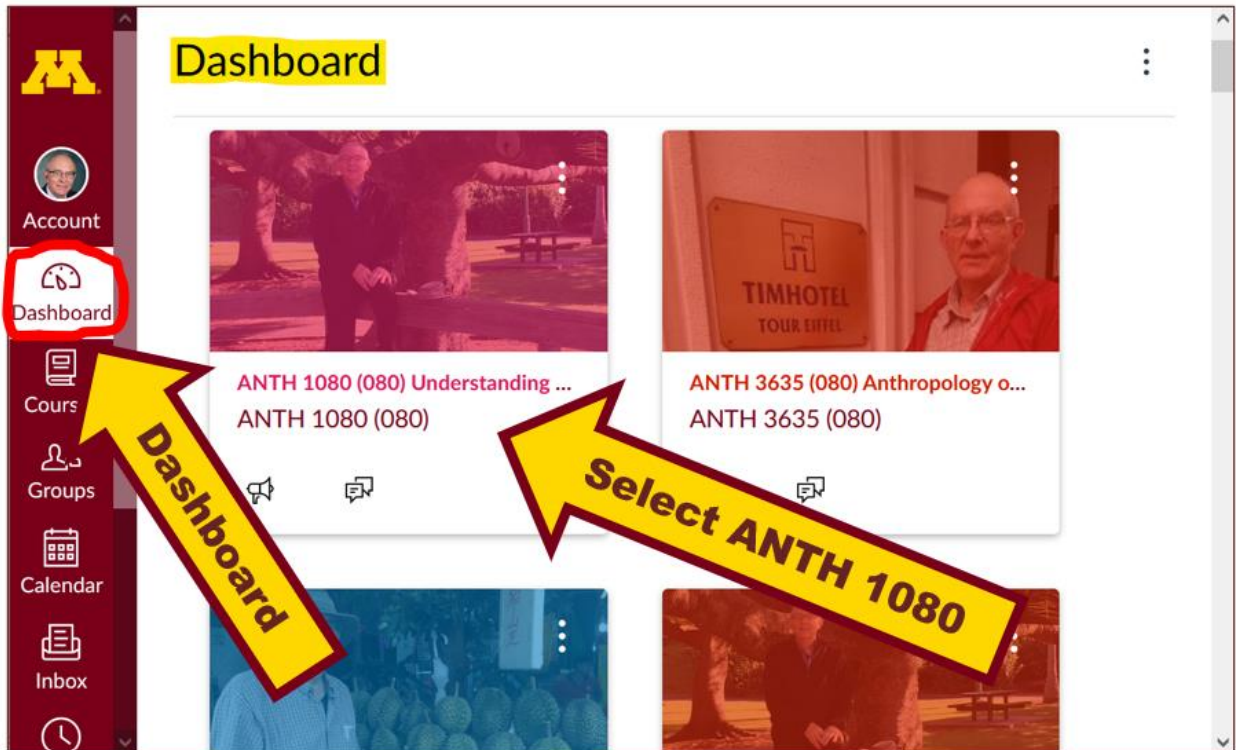

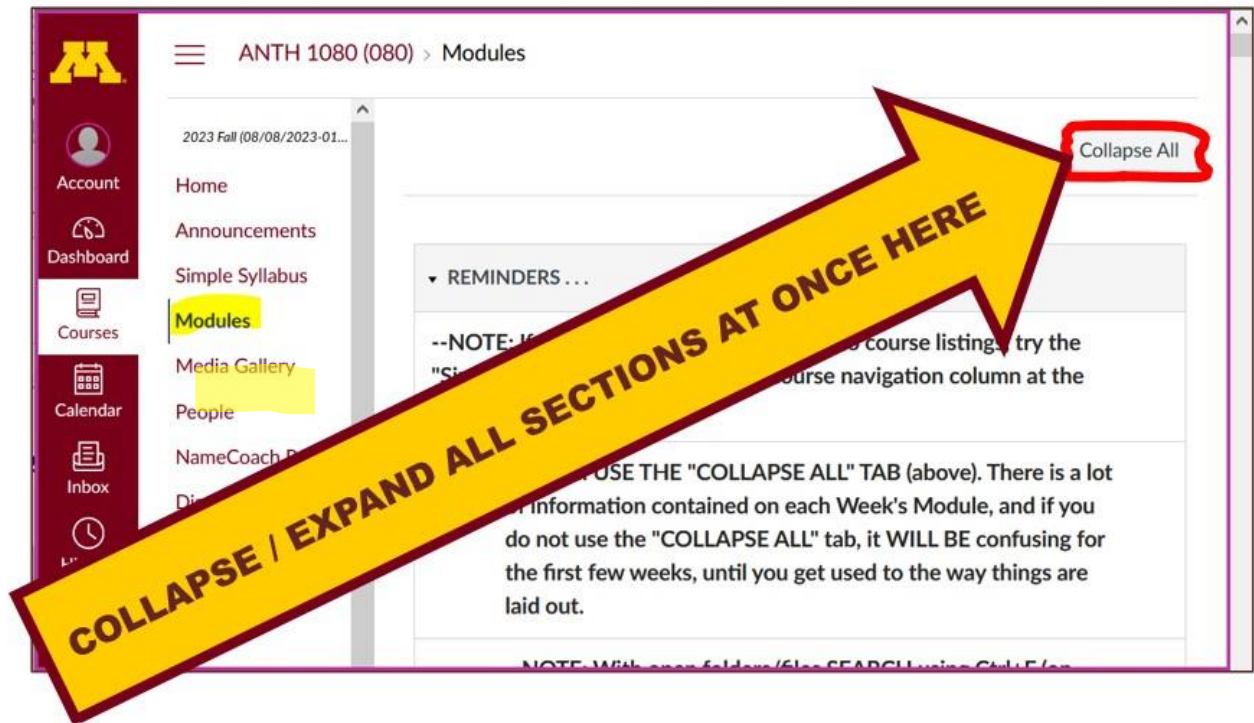

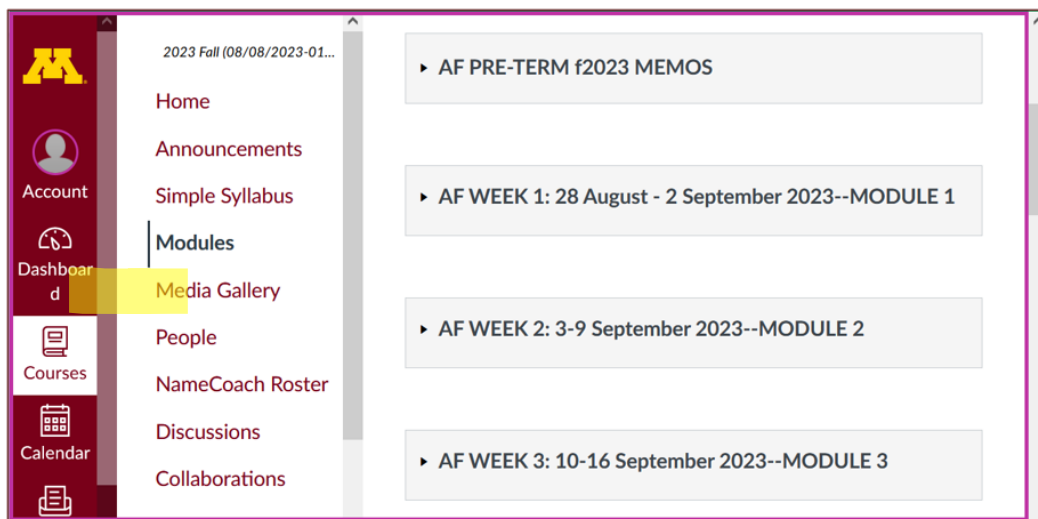
Suggestion: **To de-clutter your screen use the “Collapse All” Modules feature** (in your Modules folder) . . .

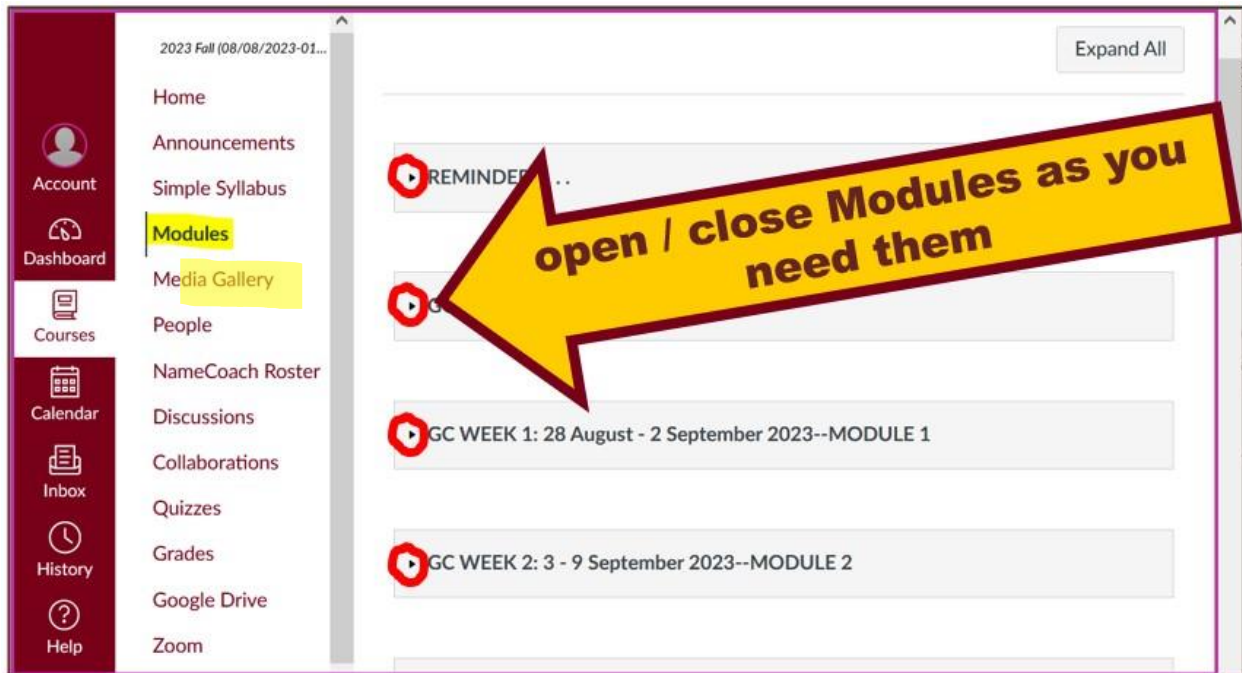
Suggestion: **And your Modules page will look like this . . .**
