Following up their excavations and discoveries we're going to visit the Olmec site of what is often said to be the "Mother Culture" of Ancient Middle Americans . . .

Excavations at La Venta

(29 min., 1986, VC 3284)

[By the way, this is NOT the same La Venta that the folks searching for the Lost Cave People are talking about.]

And we'll finish off our tour by having a look at why the folks that built the ancient Olmec site of La Venta in the modernday state of Tabasco WERE NOT people who spread out ("diffused") from Egypt after building the famous Ancient Pyramids there:

"Looking for One Beginning: The Fallacy of Diffusionism"

It will be a great tour, and when it is over we'll return to review the materials and begin preparations for the Midterm Exam.


