[By the way, this is NOT the same La Venta that the folks searching for the Lost Cave People are talking about.]

And we'll finish off our tour by having a look at why the folks that built the ancient Olmec site of La Venta in the modern-day state of Tabasco WERE NOT people who spread out ("diffused") from Egypt after building the famous Ancient Pyramids there:


