

## General Comments for the Week . . .

As mentioned earlier, you can see in the newspapers and other media that lots of interesting things are happening in the world of the Anthropology of Europe. For an up-to-date review of what's happening in general in Europe see **BBC News Europe** (from the world's largest broadcast news organization, required by Royal Charter to report impartially), or have a look at the **UK News** from **The Guardian** ("*center-left, with exceptional investigative reporting*" / liberal), and **The New York Times**.

Also as mentioned, there is an excellent **Media Bias Chart** available to help you sort out the fake news from the rest, and to give you some indicating of the biases of others not regarded as purveyors of fake news and "alternative facts." When looking up information for this course, try to stay with the sources listed inside of the green triangle at the very top on the Media Bias Chart.








