## What does Mexico have to do with Europe?

In Susan Parman and friends' work—*Europe in the Anthropological Imagination*—it is noted that Europe came into the anthropological imagination influenced very strongly by people in and associated with the University of Chicago and its focus on Mesoamerican and Chicano community and family studies. Without that influence, anthropological studies of Europe might still be lingering primarily in someone's imagination. Or it certainly would be a different breed. It would be difficult to

understand the development of the Anthropology of Europe—and how we got here without understanding the contributions of **the "Chicago School"** and its associated folks. I'll talk more about that in class.


