
Midterm Exam

After the exam, on Wednesday, we'll try to work in a little time to look at ESP—Extra-Sensory-Perception.

And we'll first add a few more dimensions to our Cognition Model, and add a little bit of information on the "Culturally Constituted Behavioral Environment" (CCBE).
