We'll have a look at how medicine doctors manage to be successful healers, more successful in some ways than the doctors at St. Luke's or St. Mary's, or even the Mayo Clinic, for that matter.

How does it all work?

We'll have a look at **Anishinabe Curing** practices and how and why they—and native healing practices like them worldwide—work. They're powerful. They're based on power and the belief in power.

If you haven't read the paper on Power: "Nature and the Concept of Power Among Mississippi and Lake Superior Ojibwa: Reflections of Paul Buffalo," please do that.

The first part is my (etic) introduction to Paul and Anishinabe peoples; the second part is Paul's (emic) description of how he and his people get spiritual power from nature—spiritual power they use in healing individuals and the collective soul. If you want, focus on what Paul Buffalo has to say. Some of these same things we will see in excerpts from an interview videotaped by students at UMD [excerpts transcript].

We will not finish Anishinabe healing this week, as—just like the Medicine Men do—we'll pause the healing procedure to reflect on other things in life.
