

This week we're off to Turkey where we'll meet Elif, a 12-year-old Turkish girl, who will tell us about her religious Sufi spiritual journey, up-until-so-far, similarly to the way Chai Thao two weeks ago introduced us to her Hmong traditions in Appleton, Wisconsin. Elif is part of the Mevlevi Brotherhood, known as "Whirling Dervishes" in the Western world. They are a part of Sufi/Mystic traditional Islam.







But, in the end, they are both human judgments.

The biggest difference between a Major League Umpire calling balls and strikes and a professor calling a grade is that you jet ejected from the baseball game if you are argue balls and strikes (see Section 9.02 Official Baseball Rules <a href="http://mlb.mlb.com/mlb/official info/official rules/foreword.jsp">http://mlb.mlb.com/mlb/official info/official rules/foreword.jsp</a> and one *should* really question the prof if they didn't like the call, and that is especially true for midterm exams as one can often learn quite a bit that is helpful for the Final Exam by looking over and discussing a midterm exam.

Maybe a better analogy would be judging **Olympic Figure Skating**, **or Gymnastics**, **or Ski Jumping**, **Diving** and the




